# System Updates & Industrial Sales Report

## **State Water Commission**

Wirtz reported that WAWS has presented the SWC, NDIC, and BND with a funding plan. The plan is to get additional loan dollars to match towards our \$60m.

The State Water Commission wants an approved project list. Wirtz presented the board with an \$80 M Project Plan which consists of \$26.8 Transmission, \$51.7 Rural Distribution and \$1.5 Supply & Transmission. **Zubke moved to approve the \$80M project plan, Koeser seconded.**
