### **Executive Director's Report**

## **System Updates & Industrial Sales Report**

Wirtz gave a system update. He reported about the leak on the 36" transmission line and that WBI will soon be boring under the Missouri River. The WBI bore will run parallel to our transmission line.

The industrial sales for February were \$805,577.00.

# **Project Prioritization**

A Phase V Project Prioritization list was given to the board with purposed project prioritization based on the amount of possible future funding. There was discussion on the amount of funding WAWSA should request for the 2017-2019 biennium. It was the board's suggestion to ask for \$60M; \$45M in grant and \$15M in loan.

#### \$10m Loan

Wirtz discussed various options available for the additional \$10M loan needed for the 2015-2017 biennium funding.

#### 2010 Baseline Sales

A memorandum concerning the 2010 baseline sales deferment was sent out to the Members and Sub-members for their board's approval. Stanley, Crosby and Tioga have signed the memorandum.

#### **Wastewater Sales Amendment**

WAWSA is still waiting on the cities of Ray and Williston to sign the Wastewater Sales Amendment.

#### **Bill Drafts**

The board discussed the option of drafting bills for the next legislative session concerning WAWSA having bonding authority and decreasing the interest rate on NDGF and NDWRTF industrial loans.

### **Water Topics Overview Committee**

Wirtz reported that Chairman Owan presented at the ND Legislative Water Topics overview committee meeting held on March 7th and 8th in Bismarck, ND.

## **Board Meeting Dates**

Change Order #20 in the amount of \$29,811.00 for the repair of a leak on the 30" existing high service transmission line and PKG Contracting, Inc. Change Order #21 in the amount of \$124,777.00 for repair to the clear well baffle curtain to the board for their approval. **Veeder moved to approve Change Orders #19, #20 & #21, Haake seconded.**
