# **Executive Director's Report**

# System Updates & Industrial Sales Report

Wirtz gave system and reclamation updates.

## **Industrial Sales**

The industrial sales for April were \$636,783.00.

### NDIC Meeting

Wirtz reported on the May 1st NDIC meeting.

#### 2017 Legislative Session

Wirtz reported that HB 1020 was approved. The State Water Commission has the responsibility of distributing the grant monies for rural projects. The SWC has the authority to allocate the money where they deem necessary. The amount designated for WAWSA projects has not been determined as of this date.

### **Future Loan Funding**

Wirtz discussed potential grant amounts and possible loan sources available for cost share.

## Request to Purchase

Wirtz requested the board's approval to purchase two heavy axel trailers for \$18,000.00 each. WAWSA will be selling a trailer and grader to offset the purchase of the trailers. Rust moved to approve the purchase of the two trailer, Haake seconded.

### Wagner Construction Update

Wirtz reminded the board that Wagner Construction has three bores on the Watford City South By-Pass project that are out of compliance. At the March board meeting Wagner had indicated they would agree to establishing an escrow account and extend the warranty of the three bores for 10 years to cover any possible bore fails. However, Norgard reported that there was a difference in interpretation on the dollar amount for the escrow account. Wagner is requesting a lesser amount for the escrow account. Haake made a motion to forgo the escrow account and have Wagner replace the three bores in question. The timing of the replacement would be subject to Wirtz's approval, Brandt seconded.

### **Joint Powers Agreement**

Wirtz presented the Joint Powers Agreement; the purpose for the agreement is for BDW, WRWD and R & T to define their respective service and operational boundaries within the WAWSA system.

# R & T Lime Sludge

Wirtz reported the Executive Committee approved a budget increase from \$250,000 to \$380,000 for lime sludge removal at the R & T landfill.

### **Shop in McKenzie County**

McKenzie County is building a new shop and WAWSA has expressed interest in participating in construction costs for additional space. Veeder requested confirmation that WAWSA was committed to the space as they are finalizing the building plans. WAWSA would cost share on the square footage that WAWSA would need for storage. The bays in the shop would be \$200 per sq ft and cold storage would be \$100 per sq ft. The amount would be approximately \$500,000 to \$600,000. McKenzie County needs an answer within the next two weeks. **Brostuen made a motion to move the final decision to the Executive Committee, Haake seconded.**
