Executive Director's Report

System Updates

Wirtz gave a system update. He reported that we will be compiling budgets from our members analyzing if a rate increase will be necessary. The Keene depot will have the lanes up graded.

Industrial Sales

The industrial sales for August were \$1,712,588.00.

NDIC

Wirtz reported on the August NDIC meeting. The NDIC will be selecting a firm to conduct a feasibility study concerning the industrial assets at their September 29th meeting.

SWC

Wirtz reported that WAWSA received \$8.75M of the \$20M grant. Construction will be able to start on the new projects this fall.

Wirtz reported that with the City of Arnegard was added to the WAWSA system. Watford City, Arnegard, MCWRD and WAWSA are discussing building one large tank that could be used by all the entities. Wirtz also reported the domestic water usage for McKenzie County is increasing.

2016 Audit

Daryl Heizelman and Tyson Schatz with Brady, Martz & Associates presented WAWSA's 2016 Audit to the board via a phone conference call. **Brostuen moved to accept the 2016 Audit as presented, Rust seconded.**

City of Ray Telemetry Cost Share

Schultz reported that bid price for the City of Ray telemetry controls was \$130,000.00. WAWSA and R&T would utilize a small portion of the telemetry controls. The City of Ray asked WAWSA for a contribution to toward the cost of the telemetry. Schultz reported that he did not see that cost to be more than \$20,000 -\$25,000. Shultz should have the cost share amount by next week. **Rust made motion to reimburse the City of Ray not to exceed \$25,000 for the WAWSA cost share, Haake seconded.**

Commencing July 1, 2018 accrued interest will be payable on August 1, 2018 and monthly thereafter. All accrued but unpaid interest as of the date of this agreement and through June 30, 2018 shall be deferred until the June 30, 2036 maturity date." This figure reflects a \$7,500 discount for WAWSA's frustration and inconvenience caused by FDE's non-completion of items until July 21, 2017 when Certificate of Occupancy was achieved. **Koeser made a motion to approve the final payment to First Dakota in the amount of \$109,650.55**, **Rust seconded.**
